ORDINANCE NO. 2026-22
AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND DELIVERY OF \$3,875,000 PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, SERIES 2026-A, OF THE CITY OF HUTCHINSON, KANSAS; AND PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF AN ANNUAL TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS AS THEY BECOME DUE.

WHEREAS, the City of Hutchinson, Kansas (the "City"), is a city of the first class, created, organized and existing under the laws of the State of Kansas (the "State");

WHEREAS, pursuant to K.S.A. 10-123 and K.S.A. 12-6a01 et seq., as amended or supplemented, the City has previously issued its General Obligation Temporary Notes, Series 2024-B, dated November 12, 2024, in the original principal amount of \$1,590,000 (the "Existing Notes"), to finance certain improvements to serve the Plum Creek Phase I Special Benefit District authorized by Resolution No. 2024-R-13 adopted on August 6, 2024, and the Plum Creek Lift Station and Drainage Special Benefit District authorized by Resolution No. 2024-R-14 adopted on August 6, 2024 (collectively, the "Plum Creek SBD Improvements");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 12, Section 5, of the Kansas Constitution, and Charter Ordinance No. 50 of the City, all as amended or

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supplemented, and other provisions of the laws of the State applicable thereto, by proceedings had, the Governing Body of the City has authorized the following improvements (collectively, the "Charter Ordinance No. 50 Improvements") to be made in the City:

(a) Improvements to certain streets (East 3rd Avenue, Avenue B, Lorraine Street, Airport Road, Kisiwa Village Road) within the City authorized by Ordinance No. 2025-20;

(b) Improvements to certain sidewalks (the 2026 SAFE Sidewalks Program) authorized by Ordinance No. 2025-33, as amended;

(c) Improvements to the City's municipal zoo authorized by Ordinance No. 2025-33, as amended;

(d) Improvements to the Fairgrounds Park playground authorized by Ordinance No. 2025-33, as amended;

(e) Improvements to the Memorial Hall roof authorized by Ordinance No. 2025-33, as amended; and

(f) Improvements to the Shaddock Park community building authorized by Ordinance No. 2026-11;

WHEREAS, pursuant to K.S.A. 12-6a01 et seq., Resolution No. 2024-R-12 of the City adopted on August 6, 2024, and other proceedings, the Governing Body authorized certain waterline improvements to serve the Spyglass Hills Water Line Special Benefit District (the "Spyglass SBD Improvements", and together with the Plum Creek SBD Improvements and Charter Ordinance No. 50 Improvements, collectively, the "Improvements");

WHEREAS, all legal requirements pertaining to the Improvements have been complied with, and the Governing Body of the City now finds and determines that the total cost of the Improvements and related expenses (including costs of issuance of the Bonds and redeeming the Existing Notes) is at least \$3,875,000;

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City is authorized by law to issue general obligation bonds of the City to pay the costs of the Improvements, the costs of issuance of the Bonds (as herein defined), and the costs of redeeming the Existing Notes;

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City has advertised the sale of its general obligation bonds in accordance with the law and, at a meeting held in the City on this date, has awarded or will award the sale of such bonds to the lowest bidder; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City finds and determines that it is necessary for the City to authorize the issuance and delivery of its general obligation bonds in the principal amount of \$3,875,000 to pay the costs of the Improvements, the costs of issuance of the Bonds, and the costs of redeeming the Existing Notes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF HUTCHINSON, KANSAS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Definitions of Words and Terms.

"Bond and Interest Fund" means the Bond and Interest Fund of the City for its general obligation bonds. "Bonds" mean the City's General Obligation Bonds, Series 2026-A, authorized by this Ordinance in the aggregate principal amount of \$3,875,000, and dated September 30, 2026.

"City" means the City of Hutchinson, Kansas.

"City Clerk" means the

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appointed and acting City Clerk or, in the City Clerk's absence, the acting City Clerk of the City.

"City Treasurer" means the appointed and acting City Treasurer or, in the City Treasurer's absence, the acting City Treasurer of the City.

"Code" means the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the applicable regulations proposed or promulgated thereunder of the United States Department of the Treasury.

"Existing Notes" means the Existing Notes as described in the recitals to this Ordinance.

"Improvements" mean the improvements referred to in the recitals to this Ordinance or any Substitute Improvements, as defined in the Resolution.

"Mayor" means the elected and acting Mayor of the City or, in the Mayor's absence, the acting Mayor of the City.

"Ordinance" means this Ordinance of the City authorizing the issuance of the Bonds.

"Resolution" means the Resolution of the City containing the terms and details of the Bonds.

"State" means the State of Kansas.

Section 2. Authorization of and Security for the Bonds.

There shall be issued and are authorized and directed to be issued the Bonds of the City, in the principal amount of \$3,875,000, for the purpose of providing funds to pay the costs of the Improvements and to redeem the Existing Notes, including payment of the costs of issuance of the Bonds.

The Bonds shall be general obligations of the City payable as to both principal and interest from special assessments levied upon the property benefited by the construction of certain improvements, from current revenues of the City authorized for such purpose, and, if not so paid, from ad valorem taxes which may be levied without limitation as to rate or amount upon all the taxable tangible property, real and personal, within the territorial limits of the City. The full faith, credit and resources of the City are irrevocably pledged for the prompt payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same become due.

Section 3. Terms, Details and Conditions of the Bonds.

The Bonds shall be dated and bear interest, shall mature and be payable at such times, shall be in such form, shall be subject to redemption and payment prior to maturity and shall be issued and delivered in the manner prescribed and subject to the provisions, covenants and agreements set forth in the Resolution adopted by the Governing Body of the City.

Section 4. Levy and Collection of Annual Tax.

The Governing Body of the City shall annually make provision for the payment of principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds as the same become due by levying and collecting the necessary taxes and/or assessments upon all of the taxable tangible property within the City in the manner provided by law. The taxes and/or assessments above referred to shall be extended upon the tax rolls in each of the several years, respectively, and shall be levied and collected at the same time and in the same manner as the general ad valorem taxes of the City are levied and collected, and the proceeds derived from the taxes and/or assessments

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shall be deposited in the Bond and Interest Fund. If at any time the taxes and/or assessments are not collected in time to pay the principal of or interest on the Bonds when due, the City Treasurer is authorized and directed to pay the principal or interest out of the general funds of the City and to reimburse the general funds for money so expended when the taxes and/or assessments are collected.

Section 5. Tax Covenants.

The City covenants and agrees that: (1) it will comply with all applicable provisions of the Code, including Sections 103 and 141 through 150, necessary to maintain the exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes of the interest on the Bonds; (2) it will comply with all requirements of Section 148 of the Code to the extent applicable to the Bonds; (3) it will use the proceeds of the Bonds as soon as practicable and with all reasonable dispatch for the purposes for which the Bonds are issued; (4) it will not invest or directly or indirectly use or permit the use of any proceeds of the Bonds or any other funds of the City in any manner, or take or omit to take any action, that would cause the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Section 148(a) of the Code; and (5) it will not use or permit the use of any proceeds of the Bonds or any other funds of the City nor take or permit any other action, or fail to take any action, if any such action or failure to take action would adversely affect the exclusion from gross income of the interest on the Bonds. The City will, in addition, adopt such other ordinances or resolutions and take such other actions as may be necessary to comply with the Code and with all other applicable future laws, regulations, published rulings and judicial decisions, in order to ensure that the interest

on the Bonds will remain excluded from federal gross income, to the extent any such actions can be taken by the City.

The City covenants and agrees that it will not use any portion of the proceeds of the Bonds, including any investment income earned on such proceeds, directly or indirectly, in a manner that would cause any Bond to be a "private activity bond" as described in the Code.

Section 6. Further Authority.

The Mayor, Director of Finance, City Clerk and other City officials are further authorized and directed to execute any and all documents and take such actions as they may deem necessary or advisable in order to carry out and perform the purposes of this Ordinance and to make alterations, changes or additions in the agreements, statements, instruments and other documents approved, authorized and confirmed which they may approve, and the execution or taking of such action shall be conclusive evidence of such necessity or advisability.

Section 7. Governing Law.

This Ordinance and the Bonds shall be governed exclusively by and construed in accordance with the applicable laws of the State.

Section 8. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage by the Governing Body of the City and publication in the official City newspaper.
